



Homework Policy and Procedures

Antonine College is owned, operated and governed by the Maronite Antonine Sisters (MAS). The College operates with consent of Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools LLD (MACS).

This Homework Policy promotes homework as a meaningful way for families to engage in their child's education and gain insight into classroom learning. Homework and study are considered important components of schooling, reinforcing classroom lessons, involving families, and aligning with our Catholic values and curriculum goals.

This policy encourages the daily practice of literacy and numeracy skills through reading and number activities, while also promoting family participation in extracurricular and faith-based experiences.

Homework is designed to complement schoolwork, with tasks that are achievable for all students and considerate of their diverse learning needs. Homework supports students by reinforcing classroom learning, fostering lifelong study habits, and encouraging personal responsibility for learning.
