Priority Areas 2025 - 2028

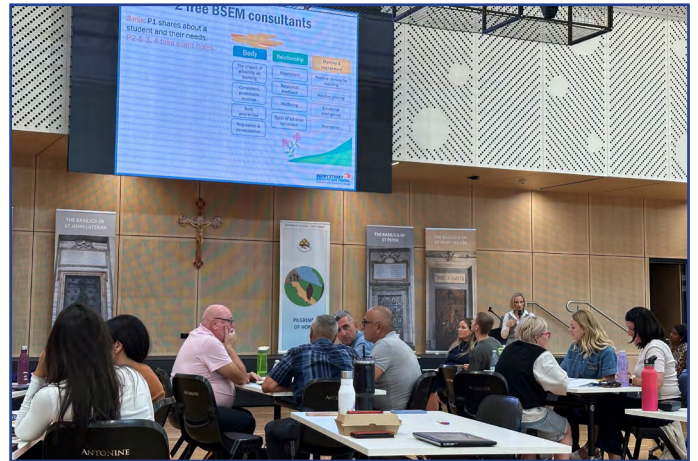
Priority 1

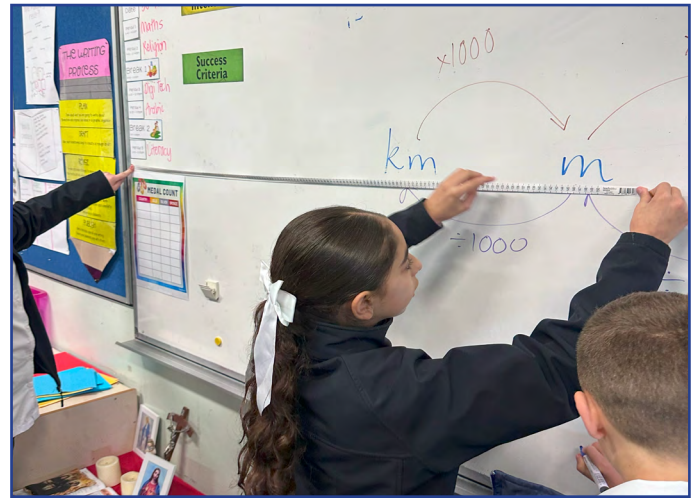
Priority 3
